

## Introduction:


Leawo Blu-ray Creator is a Blu-ray/DVD burner for you to easily burn videos to Blu-ray (BD25, BD50) and DVD (DVD-9, DVD-5) disc and create Blu-ray/DVD folder and/or ISO image file. It supports burning a wide range of videos in formats like AVI, MKV, MOV, MP4, WMV and FLV to Blu ray/DVD disc easily. Also it's easy to burn ISO file to Blu ray/DVD disc. And this burner program is capable of burning video with 3D effect, editing videos, creating photo slideshows and burning them to Blu-ray/DVD disc. What's more, the disc menu is customizable. You can edit the menu according to your personal preference.




## Part 1: How to register

### 1. How to register

1.1. If you already have the registration code, just click the Register button to open the Activation Center and input your code on the code box. If you don't have the code, click the **Purchase** button of Blu-ray Creator on the module list below and it'll take you to the purchase page of Leawo Prof. Media.



1.2. The second way is to click the **Help** button to enter the **Help Center**, and then click **Register** if you have the code. Or click Purchase to buy the registration code.



## 2. How to get registration code

After clicking the Purchase button, it'll take you to the purchase page of Leawo Prof. Media. On the page you can purchase the license of all modules included in Prof. Media or a single module. To purchase the Blu-ray Creator module, just cancel the selection of other modules and choose the validation between 1-year and lifetime (When you purchase the Blu-ray Creator module, you can get the DVD Creator module for free). And then slide down to the bottom of the page and

click **Check Out Now** to go to the payment page.



On the payment page you need to fill in the Billing Information and Payment Information. When you finish the payment, the registration code will be sent to you via E-mail.


## Part 2: How to burn video to Blu-ray/DVD file

### Step 1: Enter Blu-ray Creator module





After you open Prof. Media, click the Blu-ray Creator tab to enter the Blu-ray Creator module.

### Step 2: Add Source File




To add source video to the Creator, you can directly drag and drop the source video file to the interface or choose **Add Video>Add Video/Add Video Folder** to select a single video or a video folder from your computer.

### Step 3: Output Settings



Choose to burn to BD-50, BD-25, DVD-9, DVD-5

and choose the aspect ratio of the video between 4:3 and 16:9 (you can only go with 16:9 when burning to Blu-ray). Set quality to “Fit to disc” which best fits the video. The bar



next to the **Aspect Ratio** option shows how big the file is going to be. Before you get to the next step, you can edit the video and the disc menu, to see more details please check Part 6 video editing and Part 5 Disc Menu Customization. And you can choose the subtitles and sound tracks


you like on the file. Click to choose the subtitles you want, you can even

import one from your computer. Click to choose a sound track in the file.


(Note: You can only choose one set of subtitles and one sound track for the output file.)

And you can go to the **Settings** to choose the **Burning Engine** and **Default video mode**. Click

**Settings** button, and then click **Copy & Burn**.



#### Step 4: Burning Settings



Click the green **Burn** button  on the interface to call out a sidebar. You can rename the label of the output file on the **Disc Label** box. If you want to convert the

video into a Blu-ray/DVD folder, check the **Folder** option  Folder. Or if ISO file is what you are going for, check ISO File option  ISO File. And set the directory for the output file under


**Save to** Option by clicking Browse button . And then click the Burn button at the bottom to start converting video to Blu-ray/DVD folder or ISO file. (Note: You are allowed to check both **Folder** and **ISO File** to create a Blu-ray/DVD folder and an ISO file at the same time.)

If you have a blank disc inserted to your CD-ROM, you can burn the video or ISO file to the blank disc. The option for burning to blank disc




should be enabled.

Choose the blank disc as target and click the **Burn** button at the bottom of the sidebar to start burning video to the blank disc.




During the burning process you can click **Cancel** button to cancel it. Also you can see the progress and the remaining time of the process on this page.




When the burning process is done, click **Finish** button to finish the whole process and go back to the main interface of Leawo Blu-ray Creator

### Part 3: How to burn ISO file to a blank Blu-ray/DVD disc




#### Step 1: Add source ISO file

Click **Add File**  **Add Video** button, on the following pop-up menu, click **Add ISO File**  and choose the ISO file on your computer to import to the BD Creator.

## Step 2: Burn ISO file


Make sure that you've inserted a blank disc into your CD-ROM. After you import the ISO file to the burner, there would be a pop-up window. Choose the CD-ROM you put the blank disc in as the target on the **Copy to** box and you can edit the disc label. And then click **Burn** button at the bottom to start burning the ISO file to the blank disc.




## Part 4: How to customize the disc menu

This burner program provides disc menu customization. You can customize the disc menu before you burn your files to discs or convert them to a Blu-ray/DVD folder or ISO file.

**Step 1:** There's a sidebar on the right side of the burner when you open the program, if not, click the green button in the middle of the scroll bar with a leftwards triangle to call it out.



**Step 2:** Choose a disc menu template to edit.




There are several built-in templates under **Built-in** tab you can choose. And you can also click **Online** tab to view more templates online and download those you like by clicking the



**Download** button on every template. The **Custom** tab is for templates that you've edited before and saved to **Custom**.


**Step 3:** I'll take one template under Built-in tab to show you how to preview and edit the disc menu.

**3.1.** Move your mouse onto one of the templates and you will see a **Preview** button in the middle. Click it to enter the preview panel to see what it would be like when you apply this template.




**3.2.** Click the **Edit** button on the sub-menu bar to enter the template editing panel. You can rename the title of every item on this page, and move everything to any position you want. Also you can switch the background to a picture or even a video you like. And you can also add background music to the menu as long as you don't use video as the background.


a. Double click the title you want to edit and now you can rename the title. To further change the color and size of the font, right-click the title and more options would appear on the pop-up window (You can only right-click the title to call out the pop-up window when you've double-clicked the title and it's editable.) On the window you can change the size and color of the font, and set the font to be **bold**, **italic** or **underlined**.



b. Click the second button at the bottom left, and on the following menu, click the **Background Image** button to enable the image and video option. To add a new image to the background, click the **Image File** button  and click the **Browse** button  to choose an image file from your computer. Also you can open the folder where the image is in by clicking the folder button . And to choose a video as the background, click **Video File** option  and choose a video file. If you don't like the changes, click **Reset** button to cancel all the changes.



c. Click the first button at the bottom left to call out the **Background Music** setting panel. Choose the source file from your computer by clicking **Browse** button . Set the duration of the music playback from 1 second to 60 seconds. There are other music background playback effects like Fade in, Fade out and Loop Play you can choose. Also you can undo all the previous work by clicking **Reset** button. When you are done setting up the background, click the third button on the bottom left which is the **Save** button to save all the settings.




## Part 5: How to Edit the Video


Before you start converting the video to Blu-ray/DVD disc or ISO file or burning it to a blank disc, you are allowed to edit the video. There are several video editing feature built-in that you can use.




To enter the video editing panel, click the **Edit** button on the file. You can see all the video editing features: **Trim, Watermark, Crop, Effect and 3D**.



### a. Trim



In the Trim section, you can cut the video by deciding the exact time at which the video will begin and end. You can do that by directly dragging the slider under the time bar 00:00:02 00:26:08



, and the time points on the slider will correspond to the **Start Time** and **End Time** under the slider. And you can put in the exact time as to when the video will start and end accurate to

microseconds. Next to the time bar are a few buttons. Click the Play button  to start playing

the video on the preview window above. The Start Time button  is used for setting the time point that the video being played on the preview window is at as the start time. The End Time


button , just as what its name suggests, is used for setting the time point that the video is at

as the end time after you set the start time. This Play  button is for playing the selected part

of the video. The Clip Length **Clip Length: 0 20 9** shows the length of the video you've

edited. And you can undo all those above steps by clicking **Reset**  button.

## b. Watermark




In the **Watermark** section, you can add text or image on the video as watermark. First click the **Watermark** button **Watermark:**  to enable it. You can choose to add either text or image on the video, but not both.

### 1. Add text.


Click the button next to the text option to enable text watermark. And input the words you want in the text box



1.1. To change the color of the font, click the  button next to the text box. In the color selecting window, you can choose whatever color it has on the colorboard for the text.



1.2. Click the  button to call out the font selecting window. In the window you can choose another font, select a font style you like, and set the right size for the text. There are also effect for the text like Strikeout and Underline. There's a preview box showing the sample of the font.



## 2. Add image


To add image to the video as a watermark, first enable this option by clicking the button

Image:   next to the **Image** option. Next click the **Folder** button  to choose an image file from your computer to be added to the video.

## 3. Related watermark settings

After adding text or image on the video, there are several options provided for you to adjust.

**3.1.** You can adjust the transparency of the watermark from 0% to 100% with the slider.




**3.2.** You can adjust the size of the watermark by inputting the exact number of pixels.



**3.3.** You can also adjust the position of the watermark by directly dragging it to the ideal location or inputting the coordinates.




**3.4.** You can apply the watermark to all videos by checking **Apply to All** or undo the watermark by clicking **Reset** button.



## c. Crop


In **Crop** tab, you can choose one fraction of the movie screen and remove other parts. There are two ways to crop the video: one is directly choose one part of the screen on the preview window, another is enter the coordinates of left and right and the size value.

The buttons next to the time bar is for adjusting the selected part of the screen. Click  to flip the screen horizontally; click  to flip the screen vertically; click  to rotate the screen 90 degree clockwise and click  to rotate the screen 90 degree counter clockwise. There are a few effects in the Zoom section which can adjust the border of the screen.




#### d. Effect

In the Effect section, you can adjust the **brightness, saturation, contrast and volume** of the video. You can directly pull the slider or put in a value to adjust them. And you can preview the adjusted image on the preview window. Check **Apply to All**  **Apply to All** to apply the changes to all the videos. Click **Reset** button  to undo all the changes of **Effect**.



### e. 3D


You can turn your 2D video into 3D in 3D section. Click the 3D Mode button to enable 3D effect. There are 6 types of 3D modes provided. You can choose 3D modes between **Red/Cyan**, **Red/Green**, **Red/Blue**, **Blue/Yellow**, **Interleaved** and **Side by Side**. And you can adjust the value of 3D depth by adjusting the slider or inputting a value.



## Part6: How to create photo slideshows and burn them to disc

### 1. Add Photo to create a slideshow video

Click "Add Photo" button, on the drop-down menu, choose **Add Photo** or **Add Photo Folder** to import photos or photo folder to the program. When all the photos are loaded to the program a video of the photos would be generated. Click the **Edit** button to edit the photo slideshow video.




## 2. Edit the slideshow video

In the Video section, under the video preview window you can see all the photos in the slideshow video. Move your mouse onto one of them you can see a Rotate button which you can use to rotate the photo and a Delete button which you can use to remove the photo from the video. At the end of the photo list there's an Add Photo button which allows you to add more photos to this slideshow video.

There are options to set the output video effect under the photo list. You can set the photo duration by inputting a value between 1000 and 5000. 5000 here means 5 seconds. And the same goes to the transition duration. You can set the transition duration from 1 second to 5 seconds.


This program provides a lot of transition effects for you to choose, just click the **Transition Effect**

box  and choose the effect you like on the drop-down menu.




### 3. Edit Background music

In the Audio Section, click **Add Music** button to import songs from your computer to the program as the background music of the slideshow video. On the music list there's an Add Music button which you can use to add more songs to the video.



If the song is longer than the video, then the redundant part of the song will be cut off and won't be played. You can choose the sound effect between **Fade In, Fade Out and Loop Play**.

To delete the song you've imported, move your mouse onto the music file and click on the **Delete** button on it.




#### 4. Burn slideshow video

When you finish editing the slideshow video, you can choose to convert it into a Blu-ray/DVD folder or an ISO file or you can burn it to a blank disc. Please refer to Part 2: Step 4 on the video burning procedure.

#### Part7: Help center

Click “**Help Center**”  button to open the “**Help Center**”.




##### a. Home



Click **Home** button and it'll take you to the product page of Leawo Software.

### d. Check Update



Click **Check Update** **Check Update** button to check if there's new update available.

### e. Purchase



Click **Purchase** **Purchase** button to buy the product for one-year or lifetime validation.

### f. Register



Click **Register** **Register** button to enter the registration code after you purchase the product to activate the program.

### g. Rate it



Click **Rate It** **Rate It** to rate and comment on the program.

### h. Support



Click **Support** **Support** button to go to the support page of Leawo Software where you can find some FAQs and user guides.

Click **About** to check out some information about the Leawo Prof. Media.
